Events

Darton Anniversary

22 people have booked the whole weekend with 3 others coming for part of the event. The booking rate is very disappointing and stressful. We are currently looking at a \$350-400 loss on the event. This can be mitigated by canceling the Fletcher hall and accommodation. Richard will contact site.

A discussion followed on the reasons for the poor booking numbers and what our response could be. It was felt that the loss to the shire if we were to cancel the event would be greater than running it at a loss.

It is our main event, and we would still take a financial hit by losing the deposit. The decision was made to go ahead, with intensive canvassing for bookings in the next week.

Next Wednesday we will reassess the situation and see if we can further mitigate the cost by scaling down the food somewhat.

It was agreed that the issue was largely to do with the proximity of a very large, expensive and exhausting Crown event. A baker's dozen of people from SG who had indicated they were going to come to DA have all evaporated. Numbers of travelers from the North are also down. Even locals are failing to book.

Maggie will post stern email about the courtesy of booking and canceling in a timely manner. Kerry will remind our MLH friends to let us know if they intend to come/day-trip. All will remind everyone they know to book now.

All proceeding at good pace. Information has been forwarded to Peter for online booking forms. A brief discussion on where information should be sent ensued. On the whole nothing much to report this month.
