Excerpts from a Hospitaller's Guide for Newcomers

From the pen of Sir Gabriel de Beaumont

General Information about the SCA

Many newcomers feel intimidated by attending their first meeting or feast. However there is no reason to feel uncomfortable. You will find that we are very happy to help any newcomer with any questions. However, it may help if we explain some of the traditions and behaviours expected of everyone within the group at feasts and other events.

When we are at a SCA event, we will adopt a different name than our normal name. We call this our Persona. We do not assume the name of any particular person who lived in history, but amalgamate names from history and names

that could have been. We will then work out a history for our persona and this will allow us to get an image of what our persona would have done in history. What this allows us to do is to distance ourselves from our everyday life and assume for a small time period a different character out of history.

Regardless of your persona, everyone in the SCA is assumed to be nobility, and should be treated with courtesy. To this end we refer to each other as 'my lord' or 'my lady'. As we are recreating the medieval ages, we have an internal ranking system.

While many people have other titles, if you are unsure it is always acceptable to [call someone by] the title 'my lord' or 'my lady'.

Titles within the SCA

At the top are the King and Queen. They win their position in a Crown Tournament and rule the kingdom for six months. No one is higher than them in the kingdom and at every feast toast their health. It is a great honour and burden to be a King or Queen. Ranked beneath them are the Peers of the Realm.

These are individuals who have either served as Royalty, or are people who are recognised as experts in a field, or have given great service the Kingdom. Those people who have served as Royalty are given the title of Count, Countess, or Duke and Duchess.

Each of these titles has a special meaning within the SCA. Those people who represent the highest levels of chivalry and Heavy Combat on the field are called Knights and use the title Sir or Master of Arms before their name. This title is non-gender specific. Those people who represent the highest levels of

chivalry and expertise in the Arts and Sciences are called Laurel, and use the title Master or Mistress before their name. Those people who represent the highest levels of chivalry and have given great Service to the Kingdom are called Pelicans, and use the title Master or Mistress also. All of these people are held in high regard because of their excellence in their relevant field.

While all these titles may be confusing to you initially when you attend a feast, do not be afraid to talk to people and ask questions. We are always happy to answer questions you may have.

At your first event

When wishing to attend an event, the first thing to do is to contact the [Event Steward] responsible for the running of the event. They will ask you some questions about dietary requirements if applicable and ask if you need to borrow some clothes for the event. If you do need to borrow clothes or feasting gear, they will arrange this with the Hospitaller.

When attending a feast, just remember that the SCA is a group that values chivalry above all, and basic courtesy will go a long way.

At the feast there will normally be several dishes brought out during the night. These will be brought out on platters and plates of various sizes. Be aware that the plates in front of you will be feeding your table, so don't assume that the plate in front of you is just for you. Try a little of everything that is brought out, it's the best way to enjoy the food.

Correspondence from Tamara:

The silk is purchased. We have **not** purchased the dyes, because we are testing some new local dyes to see if we like them better than the Dharma dyes we used last time. I bought small bottles of black and red, painted a couple small sections using both the new and the olds

dyes on a bit of leftover banner silk, ironed it, and have left the thing on our washing line for the last few weeks.

I'm expecting that at A&S next week, we'll take it down and decide which dyes we actually want to commit to. What we can do, pretty much immediately, is get the silk ready for painting:

- 1) put together the artwork we want (anyone have a good horn design?);
- 2) transfer the artwork onto paper using a projector which Sharon can borrow;
 - 3) wash and iron the silk;
- 4) trace the artwork from paper to silk It's looking like we may have to bite the bullet and actually pay retail for shelving parts for the frame.

Unless someone finds something before Wednesday, I'll go ahead and buy the parts and add it to the tab. Last I heard, we need two large Darton banners and two large kingdom banners. [Baroness] Katherine Kerr has asked if we want to borrow any of their banners - has anyone replied to her?

Correspondence ends.

Cooks are sorted!

Selwyn offered his Oz bank account for Darton to use for Oz payments.
